A BILL

To establish a national motor carrier safety selection standard for entities that contract with certain motor carriers to transport goods, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Motor Carrier Safety
5 Selection Standard Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. MOTOR CARRIER SELECTION STANDARD OF CARE.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—

1 (1) SELECTION STANDARD.—For any applicable
2 legal requirement with respect to a covered entity
3 contracting with a covered motor carrier for the
4 shipment of goods or household goods, the covered
5 entity shall be considered reasonable and prudent in
6 the selection of such motor carrier if the covered en-
7 tity verifies, not later than the date of shipment and
8 not earlier than 45 days before the date of shipment,
9 that the covered motor carrier—

10 (A) is registered under section 13902 of
11 title 49, United States Code, as a motor carrier
12 or household goods motor carrier;

13 (B) has at least the minimum insurance
14 coverage required by Federal and State law;
15 and

16 (C) is not determined unfit to operate safe-
17 ly commercial motor vehicles under section
18 31144 of title 49, United States Code, or other-
19 wise ordered to discontinue operations by the
20 Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration
21 (including not renewing a Department of
22 Transportation registration number) or a State,
23 for intrastate commerce.

1 (2) SUNSET.—The standard established under
2 paragraph (1) shall sunset on the effective date of
3 a regulation issued pursuant to subsection (c).

4 (b) REVOCATION OF REGISTRATION.—Section
5 31144(a) of title 49, United States Code, is amended—

6 (1) in paragraph (3) by striking “and”;

7 (2) in paragraph (4) by striking the period and
8 inserting “; and”; and

9 (3) by adding at the end the following:

10 “(5) prescribe by regulation a process for revok-
11 ing the registration of an owner or operator deter-
12 mined unfit to operate safely a commercial motor ve-
13 hicle under this section.”.

14 (c) RULEMAKING.—

15 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 18 months
16 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Sec-
17 retary shall—

18 (A) update and revise the regulations
19 issued pursuant to subsection (b) of section
20 31144 to include the requirements of subsection
21 (a); and

22 (B) issue such regulations as are necessary
23 to carry out section 31144(a)(5), as added by
24 this Act.

1 (2) FACTORS FOR AN UNSATISFACTORY RAT-
2 ING.—The regulations updated under paragraph
3 (1)(A) shall provide a procedure for the Secretary to
4 determine if a motor carrier is not fit to operate a
5 commercial motor vehicle in or affecting interstate
6 commerce in accordance with such section.

7 (d) SAVINGS CLAUSE.—Nothing in this Act shall be
8 construed to preempt or supercede any State law or regu-
9 lation relating to drayage.

10 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:

11 (1) COVERED ENTITY.—The term “covered en-
12 tity” means a person acting as—

13 (A) a shipper or cosignee of goods, except
14 that such term does not mean a person acting
15 as an individual shipper (as such term is de-
16 fined in section 13103 of title 49, United States
17 Code);

18 (B) a broker, a freight forwarder, or a
19 household goods freight forwarder (as such
20 terms are defined in section 13102 of title 49,
21 United States Code);

22 (C) an ocean transportation intermediary
23 (as such term is defined in section 40102 of
24 title 46, United States Code), when arranging
25 for inland transportation as part of an inter-

1 national through movement involving ocean
2 transportation between the United States and a
3 foreign port;

4 (D) an indirect air carrier holding a
5 Standard Security Program approved by the
6 Transportation Security Administration, only to
7 the extent that the indirect air carrier is engag-
8 ing in the activities as an air carrier as defined
9 in section 40102(2) or in the activities defined
10 in section 40102(3);

11 (E) a customs broker licensed in accord-
12 ance with section 111.2 of title 19, Code of
13 Federal Regulations, only to the extent that the
14 customs broker is engaging in a movement
15 under a customs bond or in a transaction in-
16 volving customs business, as defined by section
17 111.1 of title 19, Code of Federal Regulations;
18 or

19 (F) a motor carrier registered under chap-
20 ter 139 of title 49, United States Code.

21 (2) COVERED MOTOR CARRIER.—The term
22 “covered motor carrier” means a motor carrier or a
23 household goods motor carrier (as such terms are
24 defined in section 13102 of title 49, United States

1 Code) that is subject to Federal motor carrier finan-
2 cial responsibility and safety regulations.

3 (3) HOUSEHOLD GOODS.—The term “household
4 goods” has the meaning given the term in section
5 13102 of title 49, United States Code.

6 (4) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
7 the Secretary of Transportation.
